The Assistant Alpine Coach for the U16 program will work with competitive athletes in the alpine racing pipeline. This coach will focus on refining technical skills, developing tactical awareness, and supporting the athletic development of athletes as they prepare for higher levels of competition.

- Support athletes in developing advanced technical skills and tactical approaches to varied course sets
- Contribute to physical conditioning programs appropriate for adolescent athletes
- Assist with course setting that challenges athletes while developing discipline-specific skills
- Provide detailed feedback on equipment selection, setup, and maintenance for competitive performance
- Support video analysis and technical feedback sessions with athletes
- Assist with competition day preparation, on-hill coaching, and post-race analysis
- Help coordinate travel logistics and athlete management during regional competitions
- Document athlete progress and communicate effectively with the coaching team
- Mentor athletes in goal setting and performance evaluation

- Maintain regular communication about programming with head coach and program director
- Provide responsive communication via email, phone, and text with staff, coaches, athletes, and parents
- Assist with proper maintenance of team vehicles, training equipment, radios, timing systems, and video analysis tools

- Team player who demonstrates loyalty to the organization
- Excellent communication skills for working with teenage athletes
- Self-starter with strong organizational abilities
- Advanced computer skills including video analysis software, email, spreadsheet, word processing, and presentation software
- Confident using technology for training analysis, communication, and administrative tasks
- First Aid and CPR certification (or willingness to obtain before season)
- Valid driver's license with clean driving record
- Experience driving team vehicles for regional travel
- Ability to lift and carry heavy equipment (gates, drills, etc.) while on skis
- Passion for developing competitive youth athletes

- Experience with performance analysis software and tools
- Understanding of periodization and athletic development for adolescents

Physical Requirements

- Ability to ski at an advanced level in all conditions and disciplines
- Capacity to demonstrate proper techniques and tactical approaches
- Ability to lift and move heavy training equipment (gates, drills, timing equipment) while on skis
- Capable of working in varying weather conditions at altitude
- Ability to stand for extended periods in cold weather
- Capable of driving for long distances to regional and national competitions
